

Administrative Resolution No. 24/22

Related to: Arbitration, Dispute Board, Mediation
Re: Holding in-person hearings and meetings

The President of CAMARB – Chamber of Business Mediation and Arbitration – Brazil, in the exercise of her duties as provided for in the Bylaws[1]:

CONSIDERING:

- a. the publication of Administrative Resolutions no. 08/20[2], 09/20[3] and 10/20[4], which determine the exceptional operation of CAMARB;
- b. the publication of Administrative Resolution No. 15/20[5], which determined the suspension of in-person hearings and meetings at CAMARB facilities due to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- c. the epidemiological situation that characterizes the retraction of the COVID-19 pandemic, allowing the relaxation of health measures.

RESOLVES to revoke Administrative Resolution No. 15/20[6], in order to authorize in-person hearings and meetings at CAMARB facilities, the holding of which is subject to scheduling and prior consultation of availability, addressed to the CAMARB Secretariat. Participants in the hearings must commit to complying with current health measures, depending on the location where they are held.

However, hearings and meetings may be held in a virtual format (online), as determined by the arbitration courts, with full support from the CAMARB Secretariat.
This Administrative Resolution shall remain in force until it is expressly revoked.

[1] Art. 19 – Without prejudice to other duties provided for in this Statute, the President shall:
g) issue resolutions, regulations or acts on matters relating to the administration of CAMARB or procedures administered by it.

[2] deal with the exceptional operation of CAMARB due to the COVID-19 – Coronavirus pandemic, in effect between March 18, 2020 and March 31, 2020.

[3] extend the validity of Administrative Resolution No. 08/20 until April 14, 2020.

[4] extend the validity of Administrative Resolutions No. 08/20 and 09/20 for an indefinite period.

[5] deal with the suspension of in-person hearings and meetings due to the COVID-19 – Coronavirus pandemic.
